SVP & NUGENT: Previous newsletters have referred to support given to this charity, founded in 1881 by Fr James Nugent - more recently 250 Easter eggs for children of local families. Not all parishioners will be aware that, when St Joseph's was dedicated in November 1886, its first priest was Fr Nugent, who went on to further develop his pioneering work in social welfare in Liverpool. Today, Nugent offers a diverse range of support to vulnerable adults and children within the North West through their schools, care homes, community and social work services and social enterprise. Acting as the social welfare arm of the Liverpool Archdiocese, they support 1,000 people each year. Celebrating their 140<sup>th</sup> anniversary on April 16<sup>th</sup>, St Joseph's SVP looks to engage further with Nugent's activities, updating parishioners during their anniversary year.

Following the budget there was a great deal of comment about the govt cutting overseas aid. At a time of global stress this was appalling. The Prime Minister has said it is

stress this was appalling. The Prime Minister has said it is just for one year. If you are politically inclined you might write to express your views on ensuring that, if it will not be reversed, it is reinstated within 12 months.

One of the countries deeply affected is Yemen. Whatever the politics of the conflict, the UK govt has halved the aid it gives whilst at the same time it continues to sell the weapons causing the death and destruction to the Saudi Government. In the meantime CAFOD and its partners are desperately trying to support people caught in the middle. Sadly, destruction continues in other parts of the world where people are suffering because of armed conflicts. That in Syria shows no sign of an end and, more recently, the Ethiopian govt has responded to an armed rebellion in the northern province of Tigray with indiscriminate violence, mass murder and other atrocities amongst its own people.

In all of these areas CAFOD maintains a presence. Your donations support that work. Since the latest lockdown, and quite separately from your support for the "Big Walk for Water," your donations have totalled £1376, including Gift Aid. Thank you again. One of you filled one of the collection Pyramid Boxes. It contained nearly £35!

WATERLOO FOOD BANK: JOINT UPDATE FROM ST HELEN'S AND ST JOSEPH'S .....It's now a year since the first appeal went out to continue donations to the two drop-off points below, with both churches closed during the first lockdown. Over the last 2 weeks a further 84 bags and £460 was passed on, making a staggering 2677 bags of various much needed items from both parishes plus a colossal cash amount of £18102 during the year!! The food bank staff are extremely grateful for this unbelievable generosity from both parishes. With most items reasonably well stocked, the ongoing requests are still for basic items, particularly UHT milk, noodles, mashed potato and rice pudding. Value brands are always acceptable. Donations can be left at 39 Ilford Avenue, L23 7YE or 1 Halltine Close, L23 6XX. Cash in envelopes, marked Food Bank, can be posted through either letter box.
